This internship program affords students the opportunity to combine academic study with practical political and professional experience. WHIP is a semester long program, offered in both the Fall and Spring semesters. Students participating in the WHIP program will earn 15 hours of credit for the semester. Students will take two academic classes and will work in Washington, DC in a political internship in the public or private sector. The normal workweek for student interns is 35-40 hours. Students will enroll in two, 3-hour courses taught by Hillsdale College adjunct professors. One course will be on American Politics or Public Policy. The other course will be on contemporary American Foreign Policy or contemporary National Security. Students will earn three grades during the WHIP semester: one grade on each three-hour political science class and one grade for the nine hours of WHIP (WHP 385) that will be based on successful completion of the internship and will count toward the student's general elective credits. The WHIP program is open to all students in all majors. POL 101 "The U.S. Constitution" is the only prerequisite for the program. Students are encouraged to participate in the program during their junior or senior years. Only in exceptional cases will sophomores be admitted to the program. Freshmen are ineligible for the WHIP program. Tuition for the WHIP program is the same as a regular, full-semester class load at Hillsdale College. Students are responsible for room and board in Washington, DC.
