Students will earn three grades during the WHIP semester: one grade or each three-hour political science class and one grade for the nine hours of WHIP (WHP 385) that will be based on successful completion of the internship and will count toward the student's general elective credits. The WHIP program is open to all students in all majors. POL 101 "The U.S. Constitution" is the only prerequisite for the program. Students are encouraged to participate in the program during their junior or senior years. Only in exceptional cases will sophomores be admitted to the program. Freshmen are ineligible for the WHIP program. Tuition for the WHIP program is the same as a regular, full-semester class load at Hillsdale College. Students are responsible for room and board in Washington, DC.
