On Tuesday, April 4, David P. Goldman, *Asia Times Online* columnist and author of *How Civilizations Die (And Why Islam is Dying Too)*, will deliver a lecture on "The Echo Chamber of the Mainstream Media" at Hillsdale College at 8 p.m. ET. The lecture is free and open to the public.
