*Davis Scholarship has awarded more than \$1.2 million to local students*

Hillsdale, Mich. – Hillsdale College offers assistance and support for Hillsdale High School seniors and graduates planning to attend the College through The Bernard L. Davis Scholarship Fund. Since its inception in 1984, the scholarship has helped more than 170 local students by providing over \$1.2 million in funding.

The scholarship is open to any Hillsdale High School student who is accepted for dual enrollment during their senior year or matriculates to Hillsdale College as a full-time student. Successful applicants will demonstrate good character, be in good academic standing, and have a GPA of 3.0 or higher. They must also demonstrate exemplary leadership and citizenship through extra-curricular school activities, athletics, community service and/or employment.

“Bernard Davis was a well-respected member of the Hillsdale community and dedicated his life to educating its youth,” said Rich Moggenberg, director of financial aid at Hillsdale College. “We are proud to honor his legacy through this scholarship program.”
