Hillsdale College Hosts Networking Event with Students, Local Organizations

Hillsdale, Mich. – On Tuesday, August 29, Hillsdale College hosted *The Source* for returning students. *The Source* is a college community networking event to help connect students with clubs and organizations, local businesses, volunteer programs, and on-campus employment opportunities.

At this year's event, there were 102 campus organizations, 42 local businesses or organizations, 12 campus departments, and 21 volunteer programs represented. More than 900 college students attended this year's event.
