

PROMOTING ENDURING IDEAS IN PUBLIC LIFE. The George Washington Fellowship Program (GWFP) is a competitive scholarship program designed for those interested in a career in the public square. Your GWFP experience will include additional politics courses and one semester in WHIP.

On Hillsdale's home campus, you'll participate in special seminars and monthly discussions—often featuring visiting speakers—focused on American political thought and constitutionalism.

You'll also take part in directed research projects on statesmanship, great public ideas, and

political texts of Western Civilization. Each Fellow receives a scholarship equaling approximately half tuition beginning sophomore year.

ALWAYS THINKING. Your Hillsdale liberal arts education doesn't stop just because you've left campus. All WHIP and GWFP students take two or three academically intensive seminars in the evenings or on Fridays. You'll find your interning experience adds a new dimension to discussions about the individual, society, and how best to live.

You'll study at Hillsdale's Allan P. Kirby, Jr. Center for Constitutional Studies and Citizenship, one of Washington's most important destinations for thought leaders committed to elevating the civic conversation. (It's also home to a first edition of *The Federalist*.) Several classes in diverse fields are offered each semester, so you can continue fulfilling requirements no matter what your major.


Michael Anton, former spokesman for the National Security Council, meets with Hillsdale students. He is now a lecturer and research fellow at the Kirby Center.
