Author and historian will discuss new book as part of Kirby Center's AWC Lecture Series

On Wednesday, July 17, Hillsdale College's Allan P. Kirby, Jr. Center for Constitutional Studies and Citizenship will host a lecture from author and historian Wilfred M. McClay as part of the AWC Family Foundation Lecture series. McClay's lecture will focus on his new book, *Land of Hope: An Invitation to the Great American Story*, which explores the events, circumstances, and people that shaped the American nation as we know it.

WHO:Wilfred M. McClay is an American historian and an award-winning author. He currently
serves as the G.T. and Libby Blankenship Chair in the History of Liberty at the
University of Oklahoma. McClay is the author of several books, including Land of Hope:
An Invitation to the Great American Story, Why Place Matters: Geography, Identity, and
Civic Life in Modern America, A Student's Guide to U.S. History, and The Masterless:
Self and Society in Modern America, which won the Merie Curti Award of the
Organization of American Historians for best book in American intellectual history.

McClay has held positions as senior scholar at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars, senior fellow at The Trinity Forum, and senior fellow at the Ethics and Public Policy Center. He has received numerous awards and fellowships, including the Templeton Honor Rolls, National Endowment for the Humanities Fellowship, National Academy of Education Fellowship, and Howard Foundation Fellowship. He received his B.A. from St. John's College and his Ph.D. in history from Johns Hopkins University.
