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Two Hillsdale College-Affiliated Charter Schools Graduate First High-School Classes Seven Oaks (IN) & Ascent of Douglas County (CO) reach commencement milestone

Other graduates include Nathan Brunner, Clay Close, Nathaniel Johnson, Jazmine Ragan, Jarek Reagan-Walls, Korbyn Reagan-Walls, and Joel Sands. Fifty percent of the graduating class are <u>21st Century</u> <u>Scholars</u>, and 40 percent are first-generation college students.
