Hillsdale College Hosts Hometown Lecture Series in Mobile, Alabama

HILLSDALE, Mich. — Hillsdale College hosted a Hometown Lecture Series luncheon and speech in Mobile, Alabama, on March 29. Ronald J. Pestritto, dean of the Van Andel Graduate School of Statesmanship at Hillsdale College, addressed guests on “The Pandemic, the Bureaucracy, and the Future of American Politics.”

“Hometown lectures are a good reminder that the College has many supporters of its mission in all corners of the country,” Pestritto said.

The event took place at the Battle House Renaissance Hotel. Approximately 335 friends of the College attended the speech and complimentary luncheon.
