Hillsdale College Celebrates 50 years of Imprimis and 40 years of National Leadership Seminars

HILLSDALE, Mich. — This year, Hillsdale College celebrates the 50th anniversary of its speech digest Imprimis and the 40th anniversary of its National Leadership Seminar (NLS) program.

Imprimis began in 1972 with a few thousand subscribers. Today, it is one of the most widely circulated print publications in the United States, with more than 6.3 million subscribers. The publication upholds the mission of the College to educate citizens and promote and defend civil and religious liberty.

Similarly, since 1982, Hillsdale's NLS program has sought to foster enlightened leadership and informed decision-making by communicating the fundamental principles of freedom on which Western Civilization is based.

"These anniversaries demonstrate not only Hillsdale College's continuing commitment to its 1844 founding — which directs the College to teach and defend the blessings of liberty — but also the dire situation in America. In our current crisis, many Americans are seeking knowledge about our country's founding and the principles that will help protect their families and restore civil society," said Matt Bell, executive director of External Affairs and deputy editor of Imprimis. "Through Imprimis and NLSs, among other efforts, Hillsdale seeks to educate all who wish to learn about these essential truths."

The College hosted its most recent NLS in Colorado Springs, Colorado, on April 20-21, with nearly 900 in attendance.

Over 27,000 people have attended these seminars, and many more have viewed them online. Prominent past speakers include Margaret Thatcher, Ron DeSantis, Jeane Kirkpatrick, Thomas Sowell, Edwin J. Feulner, Milton Friedman, Rush Limbaugh, Ayaan Hirsi Ali, Charlton Heston, Robert Novak, David McCullough, Steve Forbes, and Walter Williams.
