Hillsdale College Radio Station Wins Top Honors at Michigan Association of Broadcasters Awards

HILLSDALE, Mich. — Hillsdale College's radio station WRFH/Radio Free Hillsdale 101.7 FM received top honors at the 2023 Michigan Student Broadcast Awards, hosted by the Michigan Association of Broadcasters on March 15. The station was named the "2023 College Audio Station of the Year" and received nine individual awards.
