HILLSDALE, Mich. — Hillsdale College announced the newest recipient of the Judith Finn Memorial Award, Joshua Robe.

Robe received his master's degree in politics this year from the college's Van Andel Graduate School of Statesmanship. Robe's academic interests include the relationship between religion, politics, law, and economics and the American Founding. Upon graduation, Robe will attend law school and plans to pursue a career in constitutional law as member of a constitutional litigation organization or in legal academia.
